**ALL ENTRIES MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED BY JULY 27, 2009. GO TO [WWW.WESTERNMONTANAFAIR.COM](http://WWW.WESTERNMONTANAFAIR.COM) AND CLICK ON THE "ENTER EXHIBITS" LINK. IT'S EASY!! If you do not have Internet access, the Fair Office will assist you.** Each exhibitor will be responsible for submitting his/her own entry registration. Entries must be registered prior to the Exhibit Delivery Day when the exhibit is brought to the Agriculture Department. Parents must sign if exhibitor is under 18 years of age. There will be an electronic signature box for this verification at the Online Entry System screens. For detailed, step-by-step instructions for use of the exhibit entry system, go to pages 36-37.

### Exhibit Delivery Day

Monday, August 10, 2009 - 8:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.

All entries must be in place by the time stated or they will not be judged.

### Rules and Regulations

Only one entry per class number. Article exhibited must be the work of or grown by the exhibitor, except where specific allowance is stated. Exhibits previously entered are not eligible. If there is no other competition, a premium will be awarded only if the article merits an award. The superintendent may reclassify entries not entered in the correct division or class.

No alcohol or smoking allowed in any exhibit or livestock building.

The Fairgrounds is policed both day and night, but the Fair Management will not be responsible for the loss or damage of any articles during the Fair or while en route to or from the Fairgrounds.

No two members of the same family may enter the same class number of any given division.

The Agriculture Building Superintendent is authorized at any time to dispose of any produce that is wormy, unsightly, or spoiled.

In some instances, exhibits grown in 2008 will be accepted for 2009 exhibition to adjust for the lateness of the 2008 harvest. Any exhibits harvested after August 13, 2008 will be eligible for this year's exhibition. As long as the exhibit was not entered in the 2008 Fair, it is eligible for the 2009 Fair.

At 8:00 p.m. Monday the day after the Fair closes, the superintendent will dispose of any produce or other perishable exhibits left at the conclusion of the Fair. You must retrieve your exhibit during

open Agriculture Building hours Monday, or it will be disposed of.

25% - Stage of maturity when cut

40% - Leaves

20% - Color of leaves; amount of leaves, stems

15% - Condition of hay. Free of mold, dust, etc.; free of disease; free from insect injury. It is the hope of the Agriculture Superintendent that this exhibit will be of significant educational value and that much interest will be shown in it. Your participation is sincerely solicited. A special Best of Show award with a prize of \$5.00 will be given in either Division 1, 2, or 3 ONLY if competition justifies it.

Livestock Applications must be submitted through the Exhibit Entry System. Just go to [www.WesternMontanaFair.com](http://www.WesternMontanaFair.com) and click on "Enter Exhibits". If you do not have Internet access, the Fair Office will assist you. Pen placement is on a first come, first served basis, and date and time of online application will serve as official record of application submission time. **In addition to submitting Class Numbers you want to enter, MAKE SURE TO ADD ONE ENTRY FEE FOR EACH ANIMAL YOU ARE EXHIBITING.** Parent or guardian must sign entry application if exhibitor is under age 18. **Pen Reservations:** Each owner/farm may reserve a maximum of three pens, on a first come, first served basis. The maximum number of alpacas per pen is two adults or three juveniles. Any wet or soiled sand must be taken out daily and clean sand added.

**Arrival and Departure Times:** Class 1, Showmanship; Class 2, Halter; Class 3, Produce of Dam; and Class 4, Get of Sire arrive 8 - 10 a.m. Tuesday, August 11. Check time of judging for your class.
