Rules and Regulations

ENTRY FEE \$5.00 PER HEAD. All Open Class Livestock Entry Tags must be submitted **ONLINE** by **July 2, 2009**. A Livestock Entry Application is required for each animal you plan to exhibit. Livestock Applications must be submitted through our Online Exhibit Entry System. Just go to www.WesternMontanaFair.com and click on "Enter Exhibits". If you do not have Internet access, the Fair Office will assist you. For detailed, step-by-step instructions for the entry system, go to pages 36-37. Pen placement is on a first come, first served basis, and date and time of online application will serve as official record of application submission time. **In addition to submitting Class Numbers you want to enter, MAKE SURE TO ADD ONE ENTRY FEE FOR EACH ANIMAL YOU ARE ENTERING.** Parent or guardian must sign entry application if exhibitor is under age 18. There will be an electronic signature box for this verification at the Online Entry System screens. Visa and MasterCard Credit Cards are accepted.

Pen Reservations: Each owner/farm may reserve a maximum of three pens, on a first come, first served basis. The maximum number of llamas per pen is two adults or three juveniles. Any wet or soiled sand must be taken out daily and clean sand added.

Arrival and Departure Times: Class 1, Showmanship; Class 2, Halter;

Class 3, Produce of Dam; and Class 4, Get of Sire arrive 8 - 10 a.m. Tuesday, August 11. Check time of judging for your class.

Tuesday, August 11, 11:00 a.m., 4-H Showmanship and 4-H Halter Class Judging/4-H Performance and Open Class to follow.

Special Needs Class – For special needs competitors to enjoy, compete, excel, and bond with a show llama. Also a great chance to have their own special day!

Health Certificates: No llamas will be admitted to the barn without a current health certificate available for inspection at the time of arrival. This will be strictly enforced.

Fair Admission: Open Class Exhibitors may now purchase a Season Pass anytime through August 10, 5 p.m. No charge for 4-H and FFA members. Proof of membership required..

Premium Payments: Social Security numbers must be submitted to the Superintendent by all exhibitors winning premium money exceeding \$600.00 before premium checks may be issued. Premium awards under \$600.00 will be paid in cash from the Premium Bank.

Animal Entrance: All animals must enter through the Russell Street gate at the south end of the Hockey Rink. This gate will be opened at 6:00 a.m. each morning, for feeding only. Animals exit through the new South Avenue gate at the north end of Building #34, Rabbit/Poultry/Sheep Barn. Right turns only onto South Avenue. All other Ticket Sales gates will remain closed until 11:00 a.m. Gate tickets only will be sold at the Livestock Gate. Livestock Gate will close at 11 a.m.

Judging: ALSA (Alpaca and Llama Show Association) rules and criteria will be used in judging. This is not an ALSA show.

9038 Youth packer obstacle (up to 30 mos., any sex). Carry empty pack; six obstacles.

9039 Packer Obstacle (31 mos. and over, any sex.) Llama must carry weighted pack. The class will simulate a trail condition with eight obstacles.

9040 Open obstacle, only enter if not entered in Youth Packer or Packer Obstacle. No pack required; 8 obstacles.

9041 Obstacle Pack, 2 string pack

9042 Obstacle Pack, 3 or more string pack.

9043 Grand and Reserve Grand Champion for packers. To be eligible for this award, the llama must be entered in a conformation class and either class 9032, 9033, 9034, 9035, 9037, 9038

9044 Wool suitable for homespun (up to 14 mos., any sex)

9045 Wool suitable for homespun (15-24 mos., any sex)

9046 Wool suitable for homespun (over 24 mos., any sex).

9047 Costume Class

Grand and Reserve Grand Champion of all wool classes.
