All Open Class Sheep must be tagged with an official scrapie ID tag to be exhibited at the Fair. Untagged sheep will not be allowed on the grounds. This is an APHIS rule and there will be no exceptions. To order tags call toll free 866-873-2824.

ENTRY FEE: \$3.00 PER HEAD. Entry Applications must be submitted to the Fair Office by July 2, 2009. Pen assignments will be on a first come, first served basis. Go to www.westernmontanafair.com and click on "Enter Exhibits". In addition to registering all the classes where you plan to exhibit, you must pay a \$3 per head entry fee per animal you plan to exhibit. 4-H/FFA members must pay the per head registration fee to exhibit in Open Class. If you need step-by-step instructions for use of the Exhibit Entry System, go to pages 36-37. We accept Visa and MasterCard for your payment.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Open to registered, unregistered, and crossbred sheep. Entries are open to Western Montana counties listed in the Rules Section.

Parent or guardian must sign entry application if exhibitor is under age 18.

4-H and FFA members may enter animals in Open Class competition if Open Class regulations have been met. 4-H and FFA members must register a separate Open Class entry by the July 2, 2009 entry deadline 4-H and FFA members must pay the entry fee to show in Open Class.

Sheep must be registered to show in class numbers 1-6. Class #7 is for unregistered or crossbred sheep. An exhibitor may enter two animals in each class number. The exhibitor must be the bona fide owner of their animal for at least three months before the show date. Exhibitors must be prepared to show papers. More than one member of a family may not exhibit unless registration papers show that exhibitor is a separate breeder. Exhibitor may have someone else show their animal.

All Open Class Sheep exhibits must be penned by 8 p.m Tuesday of the Fair. Judging of Open Class sheep will be Saturday at 2:00 p.m. All sheep will remain on the grounds until 8:00 p.m. Sunday. **Absolutely no exceptions.**

Pens shall be cleaned by 9:00 a.m. daily. Decorating the pens is encouraged. Bedding will be furnished. Exhibitor must provide feed.

Animals not receiving proper care during the Fair will not receive prize money.

All animals will enter at the Russell Street gate at the south end of the Hockey Rink and exit through the South Avenue gate at the north end of the Sheep/Rabbit/Poultry Barn. Right turns only onto South Avenue. This gate will be open at 6:00 a.m. daily for feeding and cleaning pens only. All other ticket gates open at 11 a.m. Gate tickets only will be sold at the Livestock Gate. Livestock Gate closes at 11 a.m.

1st Place, \$15.00 ♦ 2nd Place, \$10.00 ♦ 3rd Place, \$5.00
Champion Ram and Ewe, each class - \$15.00 and a Rosette. Reserve Champion Ram and Ewe, each class - \$10.00 and a Rosette. Overall Champion Ram and Ewe - \$35.00 and a Rosette. Overall Reserve Champion Ram and Ewe - \$25.00 and a Rosette

1st and 2nd Place animals from each class may compete for Champion and Reserve Champion for each breed if there is competition of breeder against breeder.

All Champion and Reserve Champions from each breed may come back to compete for Overall Champion and Reserve Champion ram and ewe.

At the discretion of the judge, an Outstanding 1st Place animal that did not have competition with another breeder may be asked to come back to compete for Overall Champion ram or ewe.

Rules and Regulations

Entry applications must be submitted through the Exhibit Entry System by July 2, 2009. Pens will be reserved on a first come, first served basis. In addition to registering all the

classes for each animal you plan to exhibit, you must pay a \$3 per head entry fee. 4-H/FFA members must pay the \$3 per head to exhibit in Open Class. For detailed, step by step instructions for the use of the Exhibit Entry System, go to pages 36-37.

Exhibits must be delivered by Tuesday, August 11, by 5:00 p.m. Animals must be ready for judging by 10:00 a.m. Friday of the Fair. Pigs must be earmarked or tagged in the same ear for identification.

The person exhibiting must own the animals. The swine must be registered and the exhibitor must be prepared to show papers. More than one member of a family cannot exhibit unless the registration papers show that each exhibitor is a separate breeder in his/her own right. A parent or guardian must sign entry application if the exhibitor is under age 18.

4-H and FFA members may enter animals in Open Class if the Open Class regulations are met and the animal is registered. 4-H and FFA members must pay the Open Class Entry Fees.

Only the listed breeds will be eligible for judging and awards. One exhibitor may not show more than three animals in any one Class. An exhibitor may not compete against himself for champion. Champions will be selected only if there is competition of breeder against breeder.

Premiums will be paid on the basis of the judge's record and not on ribbons. The superintendent will submit the judge's records to the premium bank bookkeeper.

Exhibitor must supply feed and troughs and must keep the pen clean. Entries are open to Western Montana counties listed in the rules at end of the Premium Book. Livestock will be kept on the grounds in proper areas until 8:00 p.m., Sunday. Those leaving early will forfeit any premium money and may not be allowed to enter next year.

All animals will enter at the Russell Street gate at the south end of the Hockey Rink and exit through the South Avenue gate at the north end of the Rabbit/Poultry/Sheep Barn #34. Right turns only onto South Avenue. This gate will open at 6:00 a.m. for feeding and stall cleaning only.
